

#### **WHAT'S IN STORE? PROJECT**

What's In Store? One step nearer...

Museums love objects. And we love to work with the community to bring their stories to life. To do that we need space.

The team working on the What's in Store? project have received exciting news from the National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF). The project has been approved to move to the next stage of the evaluation process, so its full steam ahead to get the work ready to go for the full application in May 2025!

#### What is the project going to do?


Pending approval from the NLHF in the Autumn of 2025, Newton Abbot Museum's 'What's in Store?' project will make a step change to the level of care, community access and space provided for the stored collections by building a single-story extension to the museum to house an environmentally innovative and accessible collections store. With community engagement very much at the heart of this project, an ambitious programme of over 120 engaging behind-the-scenes community activities will be delivered aiming to engage with 2,500 people.

The project will also provide the museum staff and volunteers additional workspaces which they desperately need to be able to work on managing, conserving and monitoring the collection. A programme of heritage skills training will support the project and provide opportunities for volunteers and staff to learn new skills. If the team are successful the project will also create new employment opportunities.



Special Lego building sessions based around the museum collection. These workshops are suitable for ages 6+ and offer a hands on way to explore the way things work.







This large yellow 'Jan Stewer' mug is very typical of the Widecombe Fair character pots produced by the Devonmoor Pottery, celebrating the famous Baring Gould Widecombe Fair song:


Teignbridge Lottery for Communities offers a chance to win the £25,000 jackpot every week!
