

Object of the Month

This month's objects link to the 80th Anniversary of Victory in Europe - VE Day. May 8th marks the day the Allies formally accepted Germany's surrender in WWII.

The long-anticipated news in 1945 resulted in spontaneous celebrations breaking out across the nation. A national holiday was declared and people from all walks of life came together to mark the moment. The war in the East did not end until 15 August 1945, when Japan surrendered.


